Abstract: Research on patient safety underscores the role of organizational factors in facilitating or impeding improvement. To discern the factors affecting patient safety, including specific, semi-specific, and unspecific elements, a focus on unspecific factors is crucial.

Colleen and Holger will guide us on a discussion about the role of organizational factors in resilient performance and better health care quality management.

Prof. Holger Pfaff is the Director of the Institute for Medical Sociology, Health Services Research and Rehabilitation Science (IMVR) as well as the Director of the Centre for Health Services Research Cologne (ZVFK).
